

Tree Plant Field Trip

CPE 4th and 5th grades will be participating in the Josephine County Forestry 25th Annual “Tree Plant” reforestation project on **Friday, February 7th**. Participating students will be led on a planting and learn about sustainable logging practices. Students who have participated in this event in the past consider it among their all-time favorite field trips.

Our bus will depart at 8:40 a.m. and will return around 2:00 p.m. following lunch at Riverside Park in Grants Pass. Students need to **bring a sack lunch, sturdy shoes** for hiking, work gloves (if you have some), and layered clothes appropriate for the weather, which could be cold and wet. Students should also be sure to eat a good breakfast.

Adult chaperones are needed for the trip. We'll need about 5 per class. One of the most essential duties of a chaperone is to insure good behavior on the bus. Consequently, ***we ask that as many adults as possible accompany us on the bus itself***. Chaperones also need to enforce behavioral guidelines while at planting site as they help students plant.

Transportation for this trip has tentatively been paid for through a grant from the Oregon Forest Resources Institute, so there is no charge to students to participate.
